New Employee Introduction

Brian Cowan Introduces new employees Laura Tafoya, and Amparo Gutierrez to the WIC program and Elizabeth Peterson to the Emission department. Laura Tafoya is coming from the WIC program in Flagstaff, Arizona. Elizabeth Peterson has a bachelor's degree from Weber State in Automotive Tech. Brian Cowan expresses excitement for new employees.

Community Engaging Team Introduction

Brian Cowan introduces the Community Engagement Team. Brian Cowan explains how The Weber County Commission and Weber Human Services hired an interim director to evaluate the Center of Excellence and make recommendations for its future sustainability. The interim director recommended moving some Center of Excellence staff to the Health Department to integrate them into community health programs, and the budget transition happened in January with eight new state staff positions added to the Health Department. Resource Integration Coaches (RICs) help connect individuals to available resources and promote continuous engagement. The RIC staff are Zach Baker, Lyndzi Beck, Yuliet Johnson, Julie Koncher, Elizabeth Morrison, and Jessica Neff. They help with community outreach and resource integration for families in need. Brian Cowan explains the role of social workers in public health, including outreach and engagement with families. Wendy Cooper joined the team as the Family Engagement Specialist, with a focus on bringing people into the resource integration coaches program. The Family Resiliency Program helps families access and engage with community resources to achieve self-sufficiency. The program is based on the Arizona Self-Sufficiency Measure and evaluates success through goal setting and progress monitoring. Savannah Cantwell is the new supervisor for the RIC team. Brian Cowan discusses the integration of community health workers and Resource Integration Coaches at the health department, highlighting their different roles and how they work together to engage with the community and provide resources. The staff has supported the vision to increase referrals and improve outreach efforts, with cross-training and collaboration to fill gaps and improve community engagement. Brian Cowan discusses the integration of Resource Integration coaches and community health workers at the health department, aiming to provide a more connected community approach to supporting families. The program's vision is to ensure people are supported to use available resources, with referrals made to health department services like WIC and community health workers engaging in outreach events.
